1. *Welcome – Mary Saunders, Chair*

2. *eDiscovery Presentation -Implications for agency policies, procedures, technology and standards related to records management and retention – Jason Baron, Director of Litigation, National Archives and Records Administration*

Jason Baron presented an overview of requirements for preserving electronically stored information (ESI). ESI includes (but is not limited to) email and attachments, databases, voice mail, instant and text messaging, proprietary applications, metadata, etc. These requirements were recently codified in a December 1, 2006 amendment to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Mr. Baron discussed best practices, defined temporary and permanent records and the necessity of having specified “record schedules” establishing time period for retention. Records should be migrated across technology platforms in order to maintain searchability/retrievability. Mr. Baron also discussed techniques for searching electronic records and the need for a “fuzzy button” for keyword searches. 3. *The ANSI Government Member Forum – Its relationship to the ICSP and future joint meetings – Greg Saunders, DoD and Mary Saunders, NIST.*

There was a discussion of the ICSP and GMF including their differences, commonalities and possible approaches to reinvigorate the GMF. Similarities include: common agendas and membership, although there are different members. ICSP meetings tend to be better attended and there have been successful joint meetings. The chairs of the two groups are considering holding the groups’ meetings co-located and coincident to each other. Since the membership overlaps substantially, this would provide for more efficient use of time and resources. To ensure each group’s autonomy, there could be an ICSP-only meeting and a GMF-only meeting around an overlapping joint meeting. (For example, the 1st half hour could be an ICSP-only meeting and the last half hour could be GMF-only meeting.) ANSI staff will research any potential legal concerns. ICSP chair is willing to try this approach and will circulate potential meeting dates to the ICSP membership.

4. *American Council of Independent Laboratories (ACIL) presentation – Locating qualified laboratories to assist with federal testing program requirements - Milt Bush*

5. *Upcoming Standards Education Workshop - Global Perspectives and Strategies for Education about Standardization, February 21-22, 2008 at NIST – Erik Puskar, NIST*

Erik Puskar announced the upcoming workshop on standards education that is open to all interested parties and encouraged ICSP members to solicit participation from within their agencies. Objectives of the workshop are to raise awareness of the state of standards education in this country and internationally and to develop strategies to improve the delivery and availability of standards education in the U.S. through various educational forums. 6. *Strategic Standards Management Policy Survey Results/Objectives, NTTAA Training Needs and NTTAA Reporting for FY 2007, Status Update – Mary Donaldson, NIST*

NIST is gathering information on agency standards management policies. Background for this is OMB Circular A-119 which tasks NIST with providing guidance to agencies in implementing the Circular. We plan to post the findings of the agency survey, including examples of standards management policies, on the ICSP website. The FY 2007 NTTAA report is being prepared at this time by NIST and a draft will be circulated upon completion. Agencies that have not completed their FY 2007 reports are requested to finalize them as soon as possible.
