 2. *Overview of recent initiatives on imports - John (Gib) Mullan, Assistant
Executive Director Office of Compliance and Field Operations, CPSC*

CPSC provided a briefing on recent activities aimed at preventing non-complying consumer products from being imported into the US, with particular emphasis on Chinese imports, the source of a large percentage of recent product recalls for failure to meet US product safety regulations/standards. A major area of focus was improving channels of communication with Chinese government officials in order to improve

their inspection methods. Several working groups were formed including working groups for toys, fireworks and electrical products. CPSC holds monthly video conferences with the Chinese government hosted by the Department of State. CPSC utilizes resources of the U.S. Customs and Border Patrol International Trade Data System's ACE (Automated Commercial Environment) Program, a commercial trade processing system run by Customs and Border Protection to enhance border security and facilitate trade. Mike Moore demonstrated the on-line Standards Incorporated by Reference (SIBR) Database available to the public on Standards.gov, (<http://standards.gov/sibr/query/index.cfm>.) The SIBR Database includes voluntary consensus standards, government unique standards, private industry standards, and international standards referenced in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and those used by U.S. Federal Government Agencies in their procurement activities. NIST is currently checking and updating database entries and will be providing cited agencies with lists of incorporations for accuracy review. GSA discussed their efforts to develop a bulletin advising agencies (provide non-regulatory guidance) on the availability of voluntary standards describing good practices that may be useful in agency asset management programs. This is a good example of leveraging existing voluntary standards to meet Government agency program needs.

Maureen Breitenberg provided a summary of activities and concerns related to the development of an ISO standard on Social Responsibility. Mary McKiel is the new (and only) US Government representative for this effort at the international level. US stakeholders including government and industry have many concerns about the current wording of the draft standard including (but not limited to) language concerning conformity, certain principles, sustainable development, risk management, the precautionary principle, whether certain principles are actually principles, certain terminology, "endorsement" of international treaties and/or documents, and limitation on sale of goods or services deemed
